+ Greatest Need Fund

Gifts to this fund are unrestricted and used where funding can have the greatest impact, supporting a diverse range of projects. Donations have helped purchase state-of-the-art equipment and technology, improved our physical campus and supported community projects.

+ Home Health – AHMC/AHHM

Donations to this fund are used to support providing compassionate in-home care – occupational, physical and speech therapies; nursing; social work and more – to patients with disabilities, chronic illness, acute illness or a terminal illness.

+ Hospice – AHMC/AHHM

Hospice provides sensitive and supportive care for patients with life-limiting illnesses. Comprehensive care – home health, medical social work, nursing, chaplain services and more – enables patients to manage pain and other symptoms so their remaining days may be spent with dignity.

• Behavioral Health

Behavioral Health Services at AHUV – which serves as the safety net provider for behavioral health services in the County – is addressing our community mental health and substance abuse needs.

• Mobile Health Clinic

Supporting our Mobile Clinic bus allows our clinicians to improve access to quality healthcare by providing services to agricultural workers, mobile home parks, senior living communities and the outlying regions of our large county.

• Safe Sobering

Providing a safe place to detox with specially trained staff is a critical – and urgently needed – intervention that can put an individual on a trajectory for treatment and recovery. Currently, sobering options include our emergency departments or the county jail.

• Street Medicine

The AHUV COMPASS (Community Outreach Medical Patient Advocacy and Social Solutions) Street Medicine multi-disciplinary team treats patients for a range of medical, behavioral health and substance use issues as well as performs general health checks and health education through “backpack medicine” clinics and other clinics overseen by the Family Medicine Residency Program physicians at our community’s homeless shelter. The AHUV COMPASS Street Medicine program benefits both patients and the community by treating medical problems before they may become life-threatening conditions.

+Oncology/Cancer

The AHUV state-of-the-art Cancer Treatment and Infusion Center is designed to treat the whole patient, offering a wide range of treatments, including the most advanced IV infusion therapies.

Contributions fund patient navigators, wellness outreach programs, clinical programs for underserved patients, and equipment as well as new technologies and treatments.

+ Nursing Education
